


Overview

CRITICAL/EXTREME FIRE WEATHER conditions are expected across portions of the Permian Basin and Southwest Texas. Strong winds and relative humidity below 10% will lead to critical to extreme fire danger. Dry, dormant fuels combined with the weather conditions will create a conditional risk for large, possibly significant wildfires. Windy to very windy conditions are expected, especially across the mountains and adjacent plains, particularly across Southwest Texas, leading to increased risk for rapid fire growth and spread.
